Welcome from the Chief Exective

Welcome to our first newsletter of 2024.

We have had an exciting start to the new year, launching our brand new SOS bus in Colchester High Street in early February. The event was supported by a number of partners, including Colchester Bid, The Mayor of Colchester, John Jowers and Charles Bishop the High Sheriff of Essex, Trustees, Patrons, staff and volunteers. A very big thank you to all our funders; Steve and Olly Wright who built the bus, Alex from Chassis Cabs who provided the cab and chassis, along with the Open Road team who oversaw the project, especially our longest servicing volunteer, Dennis Barnett MBE.

We were delighted to hear that we had won the drug and alcohol contract for Thurrock in partnership with Forward Trust. Following implementation, the new service went live on 1st April. Open Road will work with young people up to the age of 29 and our Forward partners will work with adults.

Our young people's service in Gillingham recently moved from our current site in Green Street, to new serviced offices at Kent Space in Chatham. A big thank you to Laura, Lucy and Katie for organising the move and finding new premises.

Our Chatham Wellbeing Service in Chatham High Street, is undergoing refurbishment in April/May as it was looking very tired and shabby. A big thank you to our funders for supporting this.

In Harlow, we are currently working out of the Derwent Centre with our partners EPUT. However, due to lack of space, we have now located a new site in The Harvey Centre. There is much work to be done, but we hope to complete this early in the new financial year so that we have moved in by the summer. A big thank you to our Trustee, Bob Kilvington for supporting this project along with the Chatham refurbishment.

We have a busy calendar of events for 2024. Our Quiz Night at Colchester's Mercury Theatre on 27th February quickly sold out and was an amazing success - see more on page 10. 



I enjoy our partnership with Open Road, who are well placed to provide a range of services to



One of our priorities is to help people sustain their tenancies - housing is such a precious resource but sometimes managing a home can be overwhelming. I have witnessed many times the patience and support that Open Road have delivered to help people to keep their home and stay safe and well. The support delivered is literally life changing to many.

Having support delivered through a partnership not only provides an advocate for our tenants, but also helps us to develop services with better understanding of needs and barriers that people face in a digital world.

How did you find out about Open Road?

I have worked with Open Road in Colchester for many years and have witnessed their flexibility to develop treatments and support as society has changed.

What is the background to your funding/donation to Open Road?

Colchester Borough Homes provides funding to provide support work for our tenants who have an addiction to drugs and alcohol.



Our partnership has prevented a number of people from losing their home and acts in a positive way to help people value their home and themselves.

This work delivers way more than the value of the grant that we provide and the bond that we have developed through working together and networking in Colchester helps make a difference to many people.

We are part of the Safer Colchester Partnership and work together with Open Road to reduce nuisance and anti-social behaviour. Our work with people who are homeless or may have been sleeping on the street, demonstrates some of the best examples of people who have welcomed our interventions and now live more settled lives with improved health and life chances.

What impresses you most about Open Road?

Everyone who works and volunteers at Open Road is positive and engaging and are committed to the values of the organisation.

The volunteering is so positive, and I've met some lovely volunteers from a range of backgrounds and each one of them has enjoyed the experience with Open Road.

What do you envisage is next for Open Road?

I hope that our partnership will continue in the future. I was please to attend the launch of the new Open Road SOS bus and am keen to see this used extensively in the Community to provide a lifeline of support and advice.

Our Fundraising

Frontline Successes

The Recovery Refuge in Essex is set up to help women fleeing domestic violence, who also have substance misuse issues. Funding from Ministry of Housing Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) supports this service. This service is one of only two running in the country, who offer specialist drug and alcohol interventions in a refuge setting. Our unique partnership with Next Chapter, has Open Road staff providing all the drug and alcohol recovery interventions, alongside Next Chapter providing the domestic abuse interventions.

Below, one of the refuge residents shares her positive story of successfully completing her time in the refuge, and continues to receive support from our recovery worker as part of their aftercare support:

"When I went into Next Chapter my self-esteem was on the floor and I felt worthless. I am 41 and since I was 17, I have been in addiction and abused in my relationships. So, when I was given the chance to change my life, I took it. Next Chapter treated me with kindness and much needed support. They helped build me up again also made me believe I deserved more from life. When I left, they continued to help me going back into the community and continue to do so. I don't know where I would be without them. If you get the opportunity to go there, I would take it. I think I would be dead without them. They gave me the skills for a fresh start and helped me believe in myself. I will be forever grateful to them,".

The Big Love Charity deliver a group called Hope for us and the ethos of the course is to equip women to know their self-worth and value, to build them up and help them to understand who they are and who they can become. The course aims to encourage women to encourage them to lift their heads to see a new path in life, the bigger picture. We are working closely with this charity and our clients are engaging with their programme and helping to build a peer support group. It will provide them with a safe environment to be free to speak openly or quietly absorbing course information and group discussions. We are proud to support this initiative; the course has real meaning, giving the ability to change lives little by little.



Recovery Stories

Our Essex All Age Recovery Coordination Service (AARCS), in partnership with The Children's Society, supports vulnerable people throughout Essex. The team offers accessible, confidential support and advice to young people and adults who need help with drug or alcohol problems, to get their life back on track. Here, we hear how client SR is turning his life around, through his own hard work and by engaging with our team.

SR was using cocaine daily. He had a history of criminal offending, was seeing his

Probation Officer and was on Integrated Offender Management (IOM); he was massively depressed. SR managed to work full time and was seeing Open Road for psychosocial interventions and other support.

SR was reducing cocaine use and working to improve his health, mentally and physically. SR's biggest worry was that his mum wanted him to move out of her house as she had, had enough of him, and this affected his mental health hugely.

SR's Open Road key worker managed to get SR housed at the local homeless support project and

this really boosted him. He reduced his use to occasional use and stated his mental health was, "the best it's ever been".

His recovery worker says, "SR thanked me and told me that I was the only person who has ever really believed in him and that if I hadn't have helped him, he believed that he would have ended up dead."

"The day that SR moved into his own place, his mother came in and asked to talk to me. She took

my hand and looked at me deep into my eyes and said "Thank you, why are there not more of you in the world. It's taken years to get these results and you have accomplished more with S than anyone else has ever done." I told S's Mum that all I did was believed in him and she looked very tearful."

A massive well done to SR for all you are achieving on your journey to recovery. We are really pleased to be able to support you in making the positive changes you have, thank you for trusting us. A massive thank you too to our amazing team members who constantly go the extra mile to support our clients to be the best they can be.

Peer Mentoring - A Case Study

Our Medway team share a case study to show the positive impact of our Peer Mentoring programme in supporting vulnerable clients.

Client A's journey with the Peer Mentoring Project at Open Road has showcased the incredible impact of personalised support on mental health. Before joining the project, Client A struggled with profound anxiety and depression, primarily stemming from the challenges related to their gender identity.

Open Road's approach to mentorship extended beyond conventional speech therapy and counselling by focusing on Client A's interests and passions. Recognising their love for history, Open Road took proactive steps to expose Client A to new environments, such as the Royal Engineers Museum. This tailored approach started a sense of belonging and allowed Client A to feel understood and appreciated.

Furthermore, the consistent engagement over several months, ranging from casual outings like coffee meetings, to walks through the community, allowed Client A to gradually build confidence. These opportunities allowed for social interaction and exploration in a supported environment. Client A has stated that "Open Road has helped me identify the greater things in life and has helped me find happiness in myself and the world".

The difference from the start of Client A's journey to today, from a young person struggling with mental health challenges and struggling with their identity, to a confident, strong-willed individual proved the importance of community – based approaches in supporting young people. The Peer Mentor Programme successes can be identified with not only addressing mental health concerns but also empowering individuals by acknowledging their interests and providing a supportive network.

The Peer Mentor Programme has proven the ability to assist and support the confidence in young people allowing them to strive harder in future aspects of their lives.


Big Love for IWD 2024
